- 9. Federal judges relying on laws of other countries when interpreting the laws of the United States. S O
- 10. Adding "sexual orientation," "gender identity," or "gender expression" to the protected classes of race, religion, age, sex, and ancestry in discrimination law. S O
- 11. Requiring employers to recognize a union without a secret ballot election by their employees (called "card check"). S O
- 12. Prohibiting abortion except when it is necessary to prevent the death of the mother, AND CASES OF RAPED OR INCEST. S O
- 13. Passing state laws that authorize local law enforcement officials to enforce federal immigration laws. S O
- 14. Repealing the federal Defense of Marriage Act, which states that marriage is the union of one man and one woman and declares states do not have to recognize same-sex marriage from other states. S O
- 15. Using human embryonic stem cells for research purposes. BEN SUPPORTS THE PROHIBITION ON HUMAN EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH. FEDERAL FUNDS TO SUPPORT S O
