- 9. Protecting individuals and businesses from being required to provide services or use their artistic expression in a manner that violates their moral or religious beliefs.
- 10. Keeping the flat income tax rate in Arizona's state tax code.
- 11. Requiring any government entity, including schools, to inform parents about their child's physical, emotional, or mental health.
- 12. Establishing electric retail competition to eliminate the current monopoly system for electric utilities.
