## RECOMMENDED POSITIONS

### Ballot measures to amend the state Constitution:

#### **Prop 128** **SUPPORT**

Allows the state Legislature to amend a ballot measure if the Arizona or U.S. Supreme Court determines that it contains illegal or unconstitutional language

#### **Prop 129** **SUPPORT**

Limits a ballot initiative to a single subject and requires that subject be expressed in the title

#### **Prop 130** **No Position**

Consolidates four sections of the Arizona Constitution regarding property taxes and allows exemptions for veterans with disabilities, widows, and widowers

#### **Prop 131** **No Position**

Creates a Lieutenant Governor position in the state Executive Branch. The Lt. Governor candidate would run on a joint ticket with the governor candidate and succeed the governor in his or her permanent absence

#### **Prop 132** **SUPPORT**

Requires ballot measures that would increase taxes to secure at least 60% of the vote to pass

### Ballot measures to change state law:

#### **Prop 209** **No Position**

Puts restrictions on medical debt collection practices. Supporters say it will relieve the heavy weight of medical debt. Opponents say it will shift the debt to taxpayers and make it harder to access credit

#### **Prop 211** **OPPOSE**

Requires certain private organizations to reveal their donors while allowing those traditionally supportive of the opposing political position to remain undisclosed. The likely unconstitutional initiative opens certain donors to harassment

#### **Prop 308** **No Position**

Allows any student, regardless of immigration status, who is educated in Arizona for two years to attend taxpayer-funded colleges and universities at in-state tuition rates

#### **Prop 309** **SUPPORT**

Requires all Arizona voters, whether they vote in person or by mail, to show valid identification

#### **Prop 310** **No Position**

Increases sales taxes by 0.1% to raise nearly \$200 million to fund fire districts statewide

## Survey Questions for Federal Candidates

1. Securing the border by blocking crossings from undocumented migrants.
2. Prohibiting abortion except when it is necessary to prevent the death of the mother.
3. Appointing federal judges who will interpret the U.S. Constitution in light of current times, rather than according to the framers' original intent or text.
4. Adding "sexual orientation," "gender identity," or "gender expression" to the protected classes of race, religion, age, sex, and ancestry in nondiscrimination law.
5. Enacting a federal tax credit program allowing taxpayers to direct a portion of their tax dollars to provide educational options such as private or homeschools.
6. Amending the U.S. Constitution to require Congress to balance the federal budget every year.
7. Providing any direct or indirect federal funding to Planned Parenthood and other entities that provide abortions.
8. Expanding background checks to include guns purchased from private individuals.
9. Protecting individuals and businesses from being required to provide services or use their artistic expression in a manner that violates their moral or religious beliefs.
10. Passing either the Freedom to Vote Act or the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act to federalize election laws.
11. Eliminating the filibuster rule requiring 60 votes in the U.S. Senate to move most legislation.
12. Regulating social media platforms as providers of information comparable to broadcast news.
